# **Competition Guidelines**

## Round 1 | Elevator Pitches

Participants in both tracks host an exhibit table. Judges and audience visit tables to hear Elevator Pitches and may ask a 1-2 questions. Elevator Pitches may be no longer than 3 minutes.

After Round 1, judges will select up to 3 finalists from the Big Idea track and up to 3 finalists from the Money Maker track to pitch in Round 2, 1-2 Honorable Mentions will also be selected.

## Round 2 | Stage Pitches

Selected finalists, 3 from each competition track, will deliver their prepared Stage Pitch. Each participant will have up to 6 minutes for their on-stage presentation, followed by 2 minutes of judges' Q&A.

After Round 2, Judges will deliberate and select first, second, and third-place winners for each track.

Since 2010, ideaLabs, a flagship program of EEC has brought together student entrepreneurs from Northeast Ohio higher education institutions. Undergraduates across majors develop ventures, apply the feasibility analysis process, and present them to a panel of independent judges for cash prizes. Past successes include DecisionDesk, NextToNothingBooks, PotHole Patch, Knotprofit, and D.R.U.M.

Each Member School held their own on-campus competition to determine who would be competing on their behalf at ideaLabs.

# Two Competition Tracks

Students have pre-registered to compete in one of two tracks:

## The Big Idea Track

Participants in this category are presenting a business idea that has never earned revenue, and hasn't been pitched at ideaLabs before. Ideas should be 18 months new or newer.

### The Money Maker Track

Participants in this category are presenting a business venture that is earning revenue and has not won a prize at a past ideaLabs competition.

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
